Since being introduced to Global Friendship Through Space Education (GFTSE) and its Partner School Science Program (PSSP), my excitement as a teacher has grown daily! The Greek group made valuable Turkish friends that we will treasure forever. They played together, worked together; they even launched a spacecraft together successfully. They hugged, laughed and I'm sure they are going to cry together on Friday when this is over and everyone goes back home.
